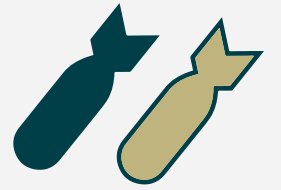

1,114 approved shelter and reception centers for the displaced have been opened, and the number of approved shelter centers has reached to its maximum capacity of 935 centers. (1)

The number of attacks launched by the Israeli occupation on Lebanon since the beginning of the aggression has reached 11,340 attacks .

The number of Israeli attacks on the health sector was 281 attacks, killing 163 people working in the hospital and relief sectors, and injuring hundreds (2)

Amid the humanitarian crisis in Lebanon as a result of the massive displacement, the recording of the first cholera infection sounded the alarm for the Lebanese authorities:



This new challenge comes to increase the burdens that Lebanon is suffering from, in light of the fragile health situation and the difficulty of securing basic services for the displaced, such as clean water and sewage networks, provide an ideal environment for the spread of infectious diseases, and pose a risk to the health of citizens.

The World Health Organization has warned that the risk of a cholera outbreak in Lebanon is very high among hundreds of thousands of people who were displaced, as the organization's representative in Lebanon, Abdel Nasser Abu Bakr, reported that if cholera spreads among the newly displaced, it could spread quickly.
