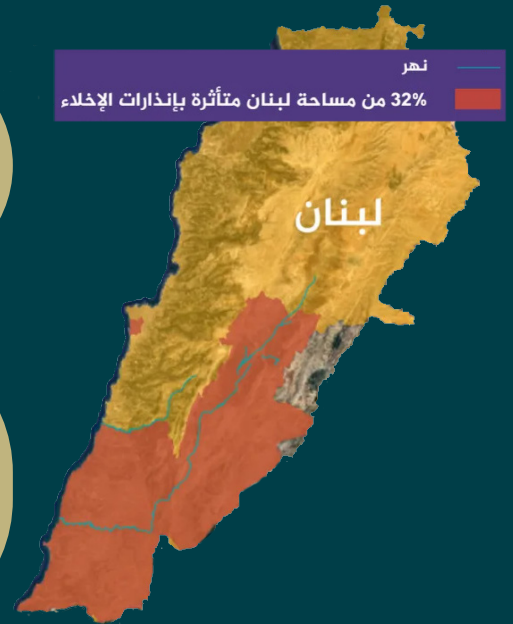

According to maps prepared by the SANAD Agency for news monitoring and verification affiliated with Al Jazeera Network, the Israeli army has requested the evacuation of 129 villages in the southern and Nabatieh governorates, which represents %8 of the total area of Lebanon. Residents of Baalbek and the southern suburbs of Beirut have also been asked to leave their homes. (1)

The maps reveal that %32 of the total area of Lebanon is affected by evacuation calls and mass displacement towards the north or the Syrian border.

Analyzing the percentage of the area of villages that received evacuation warnings from the total number of villages in the districts of the southern and Nabatieh governorates shows that the Tyre district was the most affected, with %75 of its villages receiving evacuation notices, while the Jezzine district was the least affected, with only %5.

In the Marjayoun district, %56 of the area has been evacuated, while in the Bint Jbeil district, the evacuation rate is %70. In Sidon, the evacuation rate reached %21, and in the Nabatieh district, it was %28.

Almost every child in Lebanon has been affected in some way, and many have fallen victim to the Israeli bombardment, losing loved ones, their homes, and access to education. Today, they face an uncertain future overshadowed by the prospect of extreme poverty. (2)

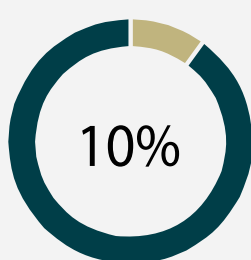

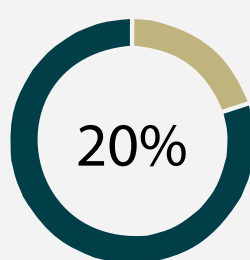
In the three Palestinian refugee camps in the Tyre area: (3)

- Basic services such as electricity, water, and food supplies are severely lacking, with food available only in limited quantities from one or two vegetable shops in each camp.

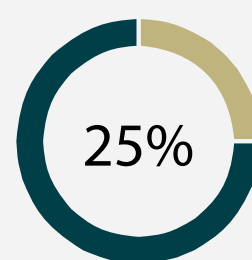
- Estimates indicate that %25 of the population is in the Rashidiya camp, %20 in Burj al-Shamali, and about %10 in Al-Bass, with around %10 in gatherings. Bakeries have ceased operations, and electricity remains scarce.
