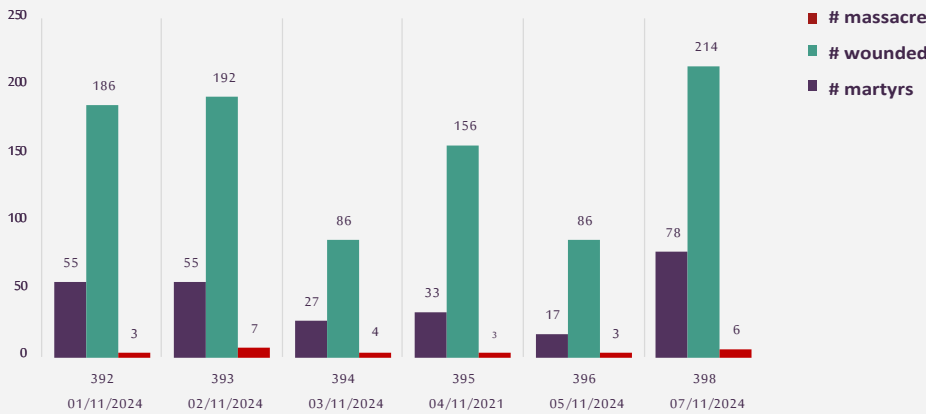

Significant Humanitarian Facts

Recent rapid assessments conducted by the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) indicate that:(4)

- approximately 15,000 cattle, representing %95 of the total population, have perished, and nearly all calves have been slaughtered. In contrast, fewer than 25,000 sheep (around %43), approximately 3,000 goats (about %37), and 34,000 birds (%1 of the poultry sector) have managed to survive.
- Collectively, these circumstances present significant challenges to the restoration of local food systems and exacerbate the reliance of the population on diminishing humanitarian assistance.

For over a year, the residents of the Gaza Strip have endured complete darkness due to an absence of electricity, resulting in a profound humanitarian and environmental crisis that has impacted every facet of their daily existence, all while the Israeli occupation continues its devastating campaign.

Doctors Without Borders has reported that the Gaza Strip is experiencing "suffering beyond imagination," with individuals in Beit Hanoun, Jabalia, and Beit Lahia enduring some of the "most brutal and violent attacks since the onset of the war." The region is subjected to indiscriminate and intense Israeli shelling, leading to significant civilian casualties, and the situation has escalated into a "nightmare."

Risks threatening Gaza Strip



Food Security (4)

- The latest report from the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) identifies the Gaza Strip as one of five regions classified as "high alert" for severe food insecurity, alongside Sudan, South Sudan, Haiti, and Mali. The report highlights that the situation in Gaza is particularly dire, with 91 percent of the population experiencing crisis levels of food insecurity or worse.
- For nearly a month, Israeli authorities have obstructed all efforts by humanitarian organizations to deliver food to residents in the besieged northern Gaza governorate.
- In central and southern Gaza, over 100 kitchens that collectively produce 400,000 meals daily are facing imminent closure due to a shortage of supplies.



The United Nations has reported that the polio vaccination campaign concluded on Monday without reaching thousands of children in northern Gaza, primarily due to the ongoing Israeli military operations.



On Monday, the Israeli Foreign Ministry announced that it has formally notified the United Nations of the cancellation of its agreement with UNRWA, which previously enabled the organization to provide support and operate in Palestine.

- According to Adnan Abu Hasna, UNRWA's media advisor, Israel, as the occupying power, exerts control over the land, border crossings, banking systems, and procurement processes. This situation underscores the unprecedented and catastrophic repercussions that the cancellation of this agreement will have on both UNRWA's operations and the Palestinian population.
- The seriousness of this decision threatens the destruction of the educational and health services that UNRWA offers to millions of Palestinians, and, as noted by the UNRWA media advisor, there is currently no alternative entity capable of fulfilling these essential functions in Palestine.
