The school year began in several public schools in Lebanon amid significant challenges facing the education sector. Israeli bombing prevented schools from opening in many areas of the south, the Bekaa, and Beirut, while other schools were turned into shelters for thousands of displaced people.

As of October 30, out of 27 UNRWA health centers, 15 remain operational while 12 are closed due to security conditions.(2)



UNRWA reported that, due to the volatile security situation in Beirut, particularly around Burj al-Barajneh, its health team opened the Shatila health center for two days on October 28 and 30.

All UNRWA laboratory services are halted in Beirut except for the Burj Hammoud clinic, which is still operating and is located far from most of the displaced people.

UNRWA faces a potential fuel shortage, especially in the Tyre area, where fuel access is extremely limited. Water pumps are operating at minimal levels, making it essential to secure fuel access within a week to ensure continued operation of water facilities in Tyre camps. Without a timely solution, water supplies in the camps may be disrupted.(2)

As of October 30, a total of 1,051 families, representing 3,669 individuals, were registered in UNRWA emergency shelters across the country, indicating a slight ongoing decline. UNRWA is monitoring this trend, noting that some displaced individuals have returned to their homes in the camps, while others have secured alternative housing arrangements by staying with relatives or renting.(2)
