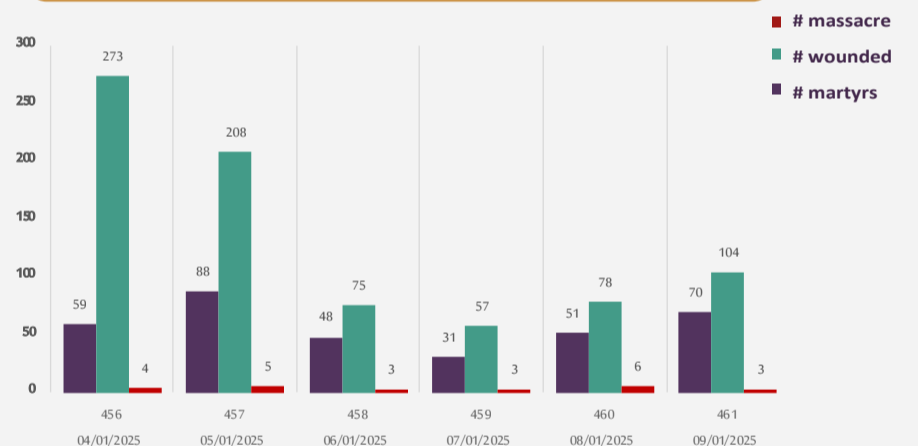

Significant Humanitarian Facts



UNRWA has emphasized that no child should perish in the 21st century due to the absence of fundamental necessities such as blankets, warm clothing, or footwear. The organization highlighted that children in Gaza are enduring dire humanitarian circumstances exacerbated by severe cold and a shortage of essential life resources.




The Under-Secretary-General for Humanitarian Affairs and Emergency Relief Coordinator stated, "Although we are committed to delivering food, water, and medical supplies to those affected, our capacity to save lives is nearing a critical point. There is no civilian infrastructure to depend upon. Israeli forces are neither capable nor willing to guarantee the safety of our aid convoys." (3)




The ongoing continues to devastate hospitals in northern Gaza, leaving 40,000 Palestinians without access to healthcare. Additionally, Doctors Without Borders has reported that the fuel shortage at Nasser Hospital in the southern Gaza Strip poses a significant threat to the lives of newborns and other patients. The organization further indicated that Nasser, Al-Aqsa Martyrs, and European hospitals in Gaza are at risk of closure due to lack fuel supplies. (3)


Risks threatening Gaza Strip



Infants in the Gaza Strip are succumbing to hypothermia as a result of the frigid winter conditions and insufficient shelter, with essential supplies for their protection having been delayed at the Gaza border for several months, awaiting approval from Israeli authorities for their entry. (3)



Recent assessments of water quality carried out by the WASH cluster have revealed concerning levels of microbiological contamination, indicating that nearly 73% of drinking water and over 97% of household water samples fail to meet the minimum national or international standards for chlorination. (3)



According to reports from OCHA, the energy crisis is escalating, with cooking gas completely unavailable in northern Gaza and being sold in limited quantities at exorbitant prices in central and southern Gaza.
