

A non-final report on the damages of the aggression & humanitarian priorities| Gaza Strip)

Introduction

Since October 7, 2023, Israel has been committing genocide in Gaza, resulting in over 162,000 Palestinian martyrs and injured individuals, most of whom are children and women, in addition to more than 14,000 missing persons.

In early March 2025, the first phase of the agreement, which lasted 42 days, came to an end. Israel then reclosed the crossings blocking humanitarian aid after allowing a limited amount of aid to enter during the ceasefire period.

Since the early hours of March 18, Israel has intensified its genocidal crimes in Gaza by launching large-scale, violent airstrikes targeting civilians. These attacks represent the most significant violation of the ceasefire agreement signed in January.

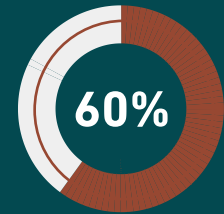

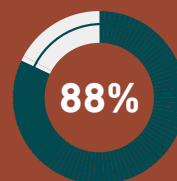

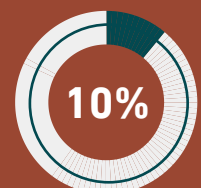

Key Humanitarian Information This Week

Bombardment of Displaced People Since Early Morning: (3)



Since the early hours of March 18, Israeli occupation forces launched airstrikes and shelling across various parts of Gaza, resulting in civilian casualties, displacement, and the destruction of properties.

- Among the targeted areas and facilities were the Al-Tabaen Government School in the al-Daraj area of Gaza City, the al-Zawayda area in Deir al-Balah, a displacement site in the al-Mawasi area west of Khan Younis, and tents housing displaced people in the al-Sultan area west of Rafah.

- A total of 404 people were martyred, and 562 others were injured from early morning until noon. A large number of bodies remain under the rubble of destroyed buildings. Among those killed, more than 170 children and 80 women were reported.

The food security sector warns that more than one million people are at risk of going without food aid during March if supplies are not allowed to enter Gaza. Between 10% and 20% of pregnant and breastfeeding women, out of 4,500 surveyed, are suffering from malnutrition, according to a recent analysis conducted by the Nutrition Group. (3)



The rising prices in local markets are exacerbating the disruption in food aid. (4)



- The prices of certain fruits and vegetables have surged by more than 200% compared to pre-blockade levels.

- Traders have started withholding goods due to uncertainty regarding when new supplies will arrive, while some stores do not have the capacity to restock their inventories.

Key Risks Threatening the Sector



Hunger and malnutrition rates have increased, particularly among more than one million children and the elderly in the sector, due to Israel's continued closure of crossings and the prevention of humanitarian aid.



United Nations agencies warn that life-saving health devices, including 20 ventilators essential for neonatal intensive care units and 9 mobile incubators for newborns, along with other aid supplies, are stuck at the borders due to the closure of crossings to incoming goods. (3)



The closure of crossings has exacerbated the severe energy crisis in Gaza, with diesel prices rising by 105% and cooking gas prices increasing by 200% compared to February. This has significantly limited access to essential fuel amid the ongoing power outages. (4)

Healthcare Sector

- 1 Fuel for hospitals
- 2 Medicines and medical supplies
- 3 Field hospitals
- 4 Supplies for safe childbirth in hospitals
- 5 Postpartum kits



Shelter Sector

- 1 Mattresses and blankets
- 2 Tents for IDPs
- 3 Cash intervention



Relief Sector

- 1 Food parcels, fresh bread and canned foods
- 2 Drinking water
- 3 Cooking gas
- 4 Clothing
- 5 Fuel for municipalities to operate water pumping stations
- 6 Cash intervention (Gaza and West Bank)
