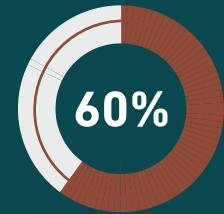

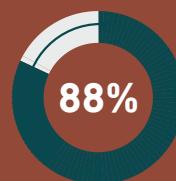

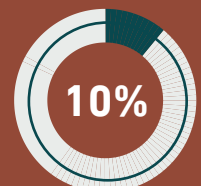

## Key Humanitarian Information This Week: (3)



1,500 Palestinians lost their eyesight due to the Israeli assault on Gaza. An additional 4,000 face the risk of blindness as a result of critical shortages in medication, medical equipment, and a collapsing health system. (1) (3)

- The health sector suffers from a severe shortage of consumables and equipment required for eye surgeries which will cause near-total collapse of surgical services, particularly for retinal diseases, diabetic retinopathy, and internal bleeding.
- Gaza's Eye Hospital currently operates with reused, worn-out surgical scissors, increasing risks to patients and preventing effective surgical interventions. The hospital is close to suspending all surgical operations.
- Injuries caused by explosions and airstrikes require supplies such as helium and fine sutures, which are nearly depleted.



Access to food and drinking water continues to deteriorate, malnutrition and disease are spreading, and vaccines are running out. Families are forced to use limited water supplies for bathing, cleaning, or cooking. Acute watery diarrhea now accounts for 25% of reported illnesses. (4)



Fishermen and farmers face high risks accessing the sea and farmland due to restricted movement and ongoing insecurity. Since March 18, agricultural areas have been further reduced. Currently, 70% of Gaza is designated as an Israeli military zone or placed under evacuation orders. (5)

## Key Risks Threatening the Sector: (5)



In April 2025, the Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH) Cluster conducted its third WISE assessment on water insecurity in Gaza. Results showed that:(5)

- 90% of households surveyed experienced water insecurity. Between 88% and 100% reported moderate to high levels across all governorates. 75% reported worsening access to drinking water.
- Main contributing factors: reduced water availability (73%), fewer access points (68%), and overcrowding at displacement sites (42%).
- Most households reported limited access to sanitation. Issues included fewer functional toilets (57%), poor hygiene conditions (57%), and overcrowding in displacement sites (49%). Households across all areas reported soap as largely unavailable or unaffordable.



Jabalia Municipality reported widespread sewage overflow in northern Gaza, caused by the destruction of essential equipment during April 2025 airstrikes.

- Over 90% of the municipality's heavy machinery is out of service, including the only jetting truck for sewage suction.
- The situation worsens with the rising presence of rodents and insects in overcrowded displacement centers. The municipality warned of a major public health crisis if the issue continues, given the limited availability of medical services.



The United Nations confirmed that over 9,000 children have been hospitalized for severe acute malnutrition since January 2025, while the health sector remains on the brink of collapse.(6)

## It should be noted that the Gaza Strip needs support in the following sectors:



### Healthcare Sector

- 1 Fuel for hospitals
- 2 Medicines and medical supplies
- 3 Field hospitals
- 4 Supplies for safe childbirth in hospitals
- 5 Postpartum kits



### Shelter Sector

- 1 Mattresses and blankets
- 2 Tents for IDPs
- 3 Cash intervention



### Relief Sector

- 1 Food parcels, fresh bread and canned foods
- 2 Drinking water
- 3 Cooking gas
- 4 Clothing
- 5 Fuel for municipalities to operate water pumping stations
- 6 Cash intervention (Gaza and West Bank)
