### Human Losses



**12,000** committed by the occupation army.

**11,850** massacres committed by the Israeli occupation against Palestinian families.



**2,165** families completely wiped out from civil records, with all members killed, totaling 0,917 martyrs.

**5,064** Palestinian families annihilated, leaving only one survivor per family, with 8,980 martyrs.

**274** newborns who were born and martyred during the war.

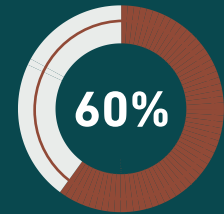

**60,000** pregnant women at risk due to lack of healthcare



**22,000** injured individuals needing to travel abroad for treatment

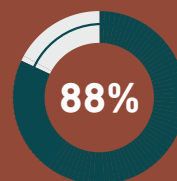

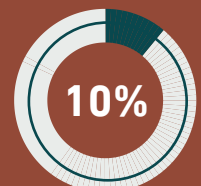

## Key Humanitarian Information This Week: (3)



The Israeli occupation has targeted more than 4,000 homes and facilities equipped with solar energy systems as part of a systematic policy to destroy alternative electricity sources in Gaza. (2)



The Israeli occupation targeted the last functioning hospital in Gaza while simultaneously expanding its ground offensive inside the Strip. After 18 months of aggression, it once again bombed the Al-Mamadani Hospital, striking the reception and emergency building and rendering it completely out of service. As a result, patients and the wounded were forced to lie in the surrounding streets in search of a safe place. (3)



Due to the aid blockade, the World Health Organization's supplies for maternal and child health have sharply declined including those for cesarean deliveries, anesthesia during childbirth, pain relief, intravenous fluids, antibiotics, and surgical sutures. Additionally, blood units required for complicated births are extremely scarce.

## Key Risks Threatening the Sector: (3) (4)



90% of pregnant and breastfeeding women in Gaza are suffering from acute malnutrition, and the lack of medical equipment prevents them from receiving the necessary treatment. (4)

- The number of pregnant women in Gaza is estimated at 55,000, one-third of whom are facing high-risk pregnancies, while around 130 babies are born daily, 27% of them by cesarean section.
- Around 20% of newborns are born prematurely, or suffer from low birth weight, or complications, and are in need of advanced care that is rapidly diminishing.



ICRC

The Director-General of the International Committee of the Red Cross, Pierre Krähenbühl, reported that the situation in Gaza will haunt the world for decades. He said that his organization is facing serious funding problems and explained that it has been particularly affected by the drop in contributions from European and American donors.



Humanitarian aid and supplies have not entered the Gaza Strip for nearly six weeks now (since March 2, 2025), when the occupation imposed the blockade. This is three times longer than the blockade imposed in October 2023 when the war began. As a result, vital humanitarian supplies, including food, fuel, medical aid, and vaccines for children, are rapidly running out. (5)

## It should be noted that the Gaza Strip needs support in the following sectors:



### Healthcare Sector

- 1 Fuel for hospitals
- 2 Medicines and medical supplies
- 3 Field hospitals
- 4 Supplies for safe childbirth in hospitals
- 5 Postpartum kits



### Shelter Sector

- 1 Mattresses and blankets
- 2 Tents for IDPs
- 3 Cash intervention



### Relief Sector

- 1 Food parcels, fresh bread and canned foods
- 2 Drinking water
- 3 Cooking gas
- 4 Clothing
- 5 Fuel for municipalities to operate water pumping stations
- 6 Cash intervention (Gaza and West Bank)
