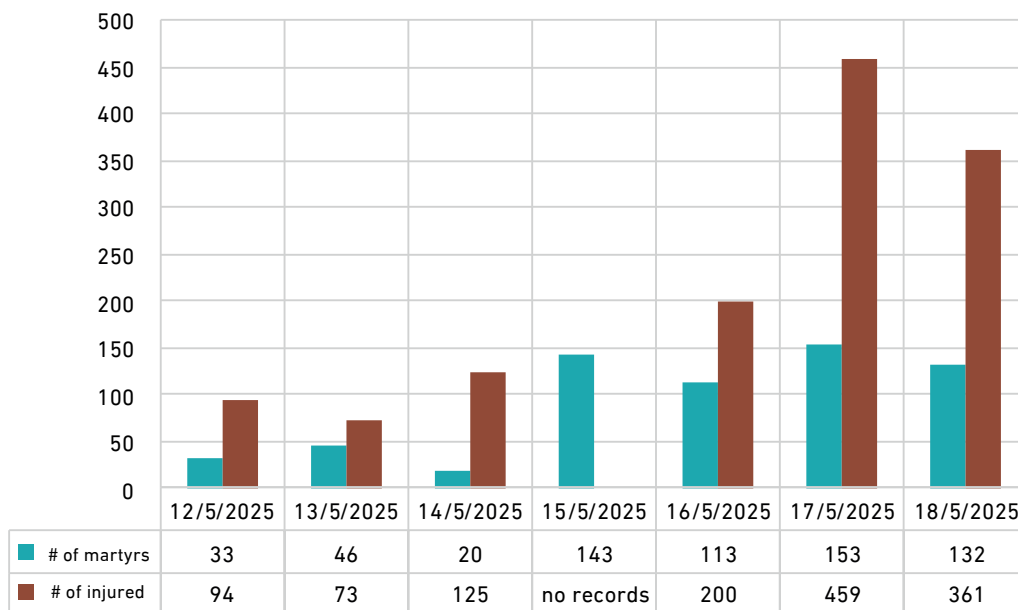

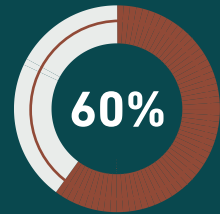

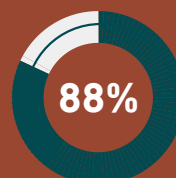

## Key Humanitarian Information This Week: (3)



Between October 7, 2023, and May 7, 2025, the World Health Organization documented 686 attacks targeting the health sector in Gaza, affecting 122 health facilities and 180 ambulances.

At least 38 health service points are located in areas designated for evacuation, and 110 other points fall within a one-kilometer radius of these zones, severely threatening access to healthcare across the Gaza Strip.

In Rafah, no primary or secondary healthcare services are operational. Field hospitals run by the International Committee of the Red Cross and the United Arab Emirates, as well as two medical points, are only providing limited healthcare services, and even those face access restrictions due to security risks.

The entire population of 2.1 million people in Gaza is expected to face high levels of acute food insecurity from May 11 until the end of September 2025:

- Half a million people (1 in every 5) are already facing famine, marking a significant deterioration compared to the October 2024 assessment.
- The risk of famine is no longer just possible, but increasingly likely, due to the expansion of military operations, the continued inability of humanitarian agencies to access the population, and ongoing escalation and mass displacement.

According to a recent assessment by the Education Cluster, based on satellite imagery collected on April 4, 2025, approximately 88.8% of school buildings in Gaza have either been directly hit or damaged.

These buildings will either require complete reconstruction or major rehabilitation in order to function again.

## Key Risks Threatening the Sector: (5)



According to the Integrated Food Security Phase Classification (IPC), an estimated 71,000 children aged 6–59 months and about 17,000 pregnant and breastfeeding women will require urgent treatment for acute malnutrition between April 2025 and March 2026.

The report highlights that Gaza City, North Gaza, and Rafah are expected to reach Phase 4 (Emergency) of acute malnutrition, while Deir al-Balah and Khan Younis are projected to reach Phase 3 (Crisis).

Key contributing factors include insufficient food intake, severely limited access to health and nutrition services, and critical gaps in water, sanitation, and hygiene infrastructure.

The long-term effects of malnutrition "can last a lifetime in the form of stunted growth, impaired cognitive development, and deteriorating health conditions," and "an entire generation will suffer permanent damage unless it gains access to nutritious food, clean water, and healthcare."



On Sunday, the Gaza Civil Defense warned that its vehicles will cease operations within 72 hours across the entire Strip, as teams will become incapable of fulfilling their humanitarian duties due to fuel shortages and lack of resources.

## It should be noted that the Gaza Strip needs support in the following sectors:



### Healthcare Sector

- 1 Fuel for hospitals
- 2 Medicines and medical supplies
- 3 Field hospitals
- 4 Supplies for safe childbirth in hospitals
- 5 Postpartum kits



### Shelter Sector

- 1 Mattresses and blankets
- 2 Tents for IDPs
- 3 Cash intervention



### Relief Sector

- 1 Food parcels, fresh bread and canned foods
- 2 Drinking water
- 3 Cooking gas
- 4 Clothing
- 5 Fuel for municipalities to operate water pumping stations
- 6 Cash intervention (Gaza and West Bank)
