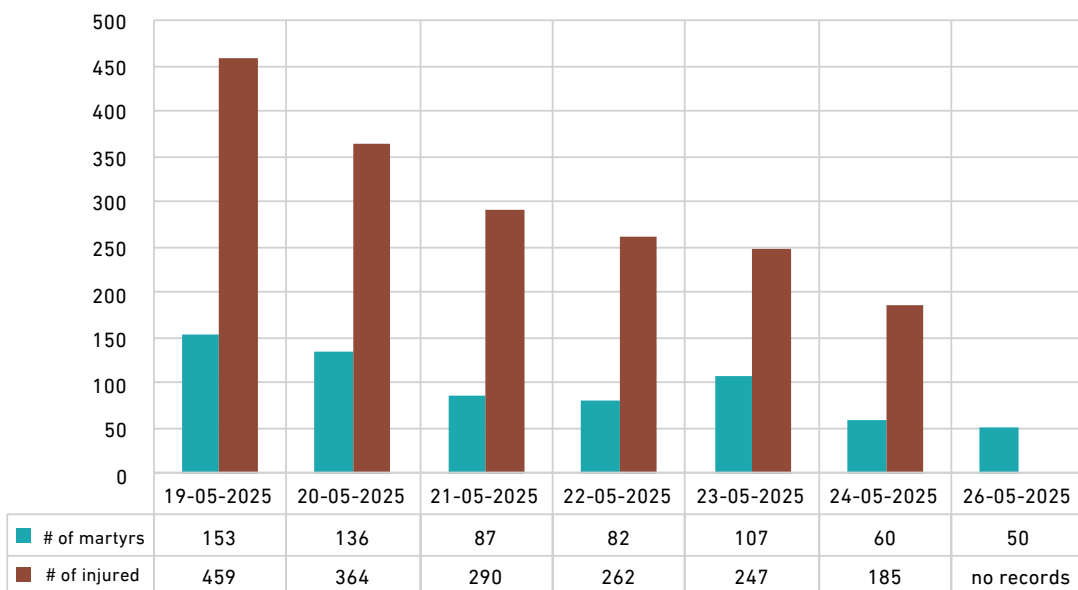

5,120 Palestinian families annihilated, leaving only one survivor per family, with 9,351 martyrs.

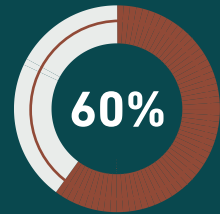

221 government buildings destroyed

34 hospitals burned, attacked, or put out of service by the occupation

206 archaeological and heritage sites destroyed by the occupation.



3,700 kilometers of electrical networks destroyed by the occupation

(68) humanitarian facilities, including (39) food and aid distribution centers, and (29) food banks that provide daily meals to the poor and needy, were targeted by the occupation.

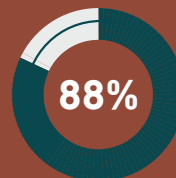

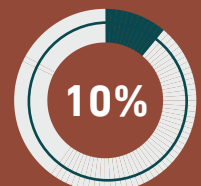

Mass Displacement and Shrinking Safe Zones

Currently, 81% of the Gaza Strip is designated as Israeli military zones or under evacuation orders. With no safe areas to flee to, many are seeking shelter in overcrowded displacement sites and temporary shelters, leaving civilians trapped in rapidly shrinking spaces.

- Since 18 March, Israeli forces have issued 29 evacuation orders covering approximately 197.7 square kilometers.

- As of 21 May, around 599,100 people (29% of the population) have been displaced again since the resumption of hostilities on 18 March. This includes nearly 161,000 people displaced between 15 and 21 May alone, many of whom fled without any personal belongings. Seven evacuation orders were issued between 14 and 20 May.



Attacks on Schools and Displacement Centers

Attacks on schools sheltering displaced families intensified over the past week, with four schools bombed within just two days.



Rapid Deterioration of Public Health

Public health conditions are worsening dramatically, with a significant spike in acute watery diarrhea cases. This underscores the urgent need for at least 70,000 liters of fuel to sustain essential water, sanitation, and hygiene services, and to prevent further disease outbreaks.

Key Risks Threatening the Sector:



Food Insecurity

The food security sector warns that one cooked meal per day is insufficient to meet the minimum daily caloric and nutritional needs of individuals.

Recent testimonies published by the World Food Programme (WFP) reveal severe hunger levels across Gaza, with reports that “parents are putting their children to bed early so they don’t have to ask for dinner.”

Collapse of Livelihoods and Access to Essentials

After seven weeks of complete border closures, a household assessment involving 824 families revealed a sharp and rapid decline in living conditions across the Gaza Strip:

Widespread food scarcity, lack of access to clean water, and loss of income for the majority of families.

The report also highlighted a severe depletion of essential survival resources—such as diverse food sources and potable water—which has disproportionately impacted individuals with chronic health conditions



Critical Health Risks – By the Numbers (2) (3) (4)



Over 10,500 patients, including more than 4,000 children, are in urgent need of medical evacuation.



Since March, 58 deaths have been attributed to malnutrition and 242 deaths due to the lack of food and medicine. Over 300 miscarriages have been linked to nutritional deficiencies.



11,000 pregnant women are already at risk of famine, while an estimated 17,000 will require urgent treatment for severe acute malnutrition in the coming months.



At least 94% of hospitals in Gaza have been severely damaged or completely destroyed. In the past week alone, 10 hospitals and medical clinics were attacked by Israeli forces, rendering them fully or partially non-operational.

It should be noted that the Gaza Strip needs support in the following sectors:



Healthcare Sector

- 1 Fuel for hospitals
- 2 Medicines and medical supplies
- 3 Field hospitals
- 4 Supplies for safe childbirth in hospitals
- 5 Postpartum kits



Shelter Sector

- 1 Mattresses and blankets
- 2 Tents for IDPs
- 3 Cash intervention



Relief Sector

- 1 Food parcels, fresh bread and canned foods
- 2 Drinking water
- 3 Cooking gas
- 4 Clothing
- 5 Fuel for municipalities to operate water pumping stations
- 6 Cash intervention (Gaza and West Bank)
