### Human Losses



**12,000** committed by the occupation army.

**2,165** families completely wiped out from civil records, with all members killed, totaling 0,917 martyrs.

**5,064** Palestinian families annihilated, leaving only one survivor per family, with 8,980 martyrs.

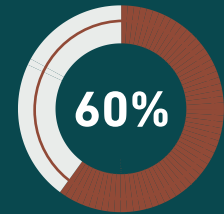

## Humanitarian Information



**38,495** children living without one or both parents

**60,000** pregnant women at risk due to lack of healthcare



**22,000** injured individuals needing to travel abroad for treatment



**350,000** chronic patients are at risk due to the blockade preventing the entry of medicines



**12,500** cancer patients facing death and in need of treatment



**6,600** detainees from Gaza during the genocide



**13,000** patients and injured individuals who have completed transfer procedures and are awaiting travel



**360** cases of health staff detention (three of them executed inside prisons by the occupation).

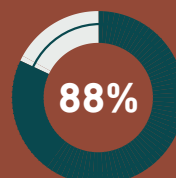

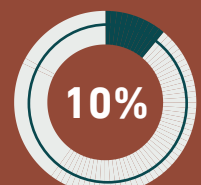

## Key Humanitarian Information This Week: (3)



The number of amputation cases has doubled since the beginning of the Israeli war due to the extensive use of explosive weapons and the direct targeting of civilians. Husni Muhanna, Director of Media and Public Relations at the Artificial Limbs and Paralysis Center in Gaza, stated that:

- 4,700 new amputation cases have been recorded due to the ongoing Israeli extermination campaign, and around 600 cases have been received since the beginning of the aggression.
- 20% of those who lost limbs in the Israeli war are children, and 48% are women.
- The center is suffering from a shortage of essential raw materials for manufacturing prosthetic limbs, and the medical teams are working under immense pressure with limited resources.



The United Nations confirmed that the food supply situation in the Gaza Strip is continuously deteriorating, and that 16 charity kitchens were forced to shut down over the weekend due to insufficient supplies.



The extensive damage to the sewage infrastructure has led to the accumulation of untreated wastewater in rainwater basins, posing significant health and environmental risks.

-The Safatawi basin in southern Jabalia, northern Gaza, is at risk of flooding. It was originally designed to collect rainwater from a catchment area of 1.25 square kilometers and has a total capacity of 27,000 cubic meters.

## Key Risks Threatening the Sector: (5)



The security situation and evacuation orders have significantly impacted the functioning of health facilities and access to them. Currently, 146 health service points are located in areas under evacuation orders, creating serious barriers for communities in urgent need of care.



The number of acute malnutrition cases identified in March reached 3,708 children, compared to 2,053 cases diagnosed in February.



The widespread destruction of homes and vital infrastructure has resulted in an estimated 50 million tons of debris, severely obstructing the movement of people and exposing persons with disabilities to increased risks during displacement. Since March 18, at least 20 evacuation orders have been issued—sometimes within just minutes—forcing residents to flee under extreme pressure.

## It should be noted that the Gaza Strip needs support in the following sectors:



### Healthcare Sector

- 1 Fuel for hospitals
- 2 Medicines and medical supplies
- 3 Field hospitals
- 4 Supplies for safe childbirth in hospitals
- 5 Postpartum kits



### Shelter Sector

- 1 Mattresses and blankets
- 2 Tents for IDPs
- 3 Cash intervention



### Relief Sector

- 1 Food parcels, fresh bread and canned foods
- 2 Drinking water
- 3 Cooking gas
- 4 Clothing
- 5 Fuel for municipalities to operate water pumping stations
- 6 Cash intervention (Gaza and West Bank)
