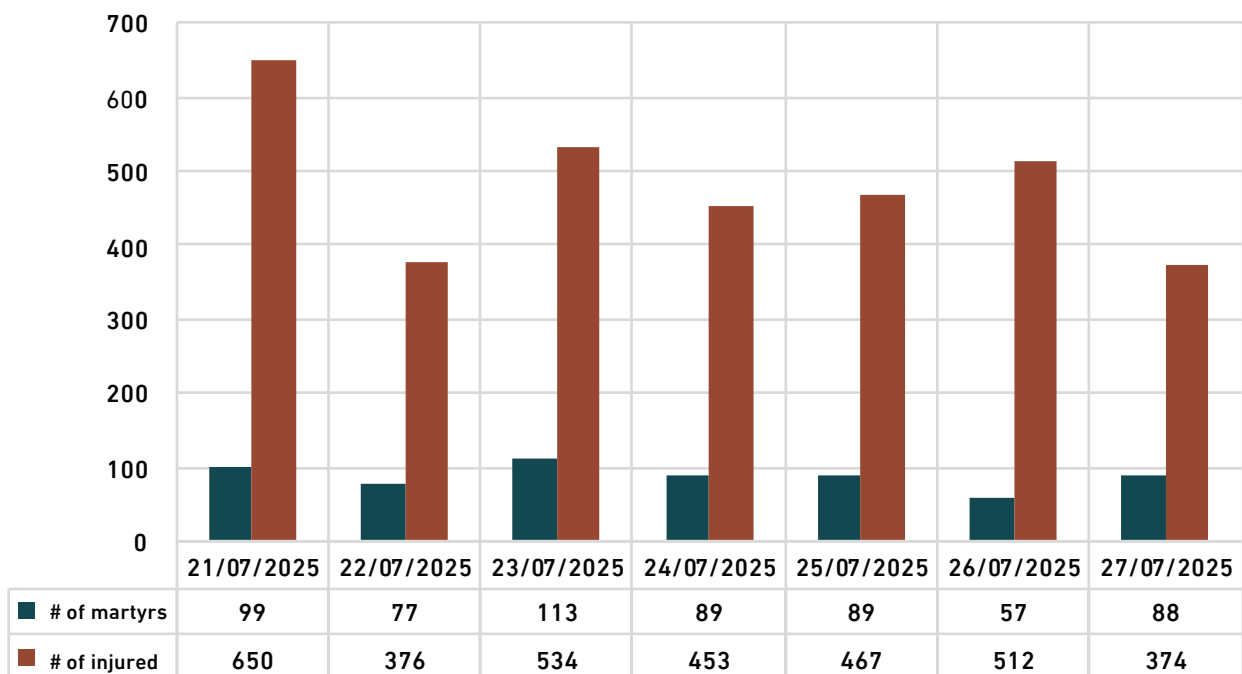

Losses in Numbers (1) (2)

Human Losses



44,537 children have lost one or both parents: 37,313 lost their fathers and 4,988 lost their mothers.



1,590 medical personnel have been killed.



19,000+ children have been killed, including 953 infants.



1,132 laborers were killed on duty, in addition to over 7,521 injured.



12,500 women have been killed, among them 8,150 mothers.



777 aid workers have been killed while securing humanitarian assistance.



9,500 individuals remain under the rubble with their fate unknown.



620 individuals died due to lack of food and medicine.



2,613 families have been completely wiped out, and a total of 38,034 families have been subjected to massacres.



228 journalists have been killed.



2,420 bodies were stolen by the occupation from cemeteries, which established 7 mass graves inside hospitals.



133 individuals (including 87 children) died from malnutrition caused by the starvation policy.

Damage to Infrastructure, Health, and Agriculture Sectors



125 tons of explosives have been dropped by the Israeli occupation on Gaza.



The total damage exceeds \$62 billion USD.



223,000 housing units were completely destroyed.



38 hospitals and 96 primary healthcare centers were destroyed, in addition to 144 ambulances targeted.



+ **130,000** housing units have become uninhabitable.



156 educational institutions were completely destroyed, and 382 were partially damaged.



Over **88%** of the Gaza Strip has been destroyed.



833 mosques, 3 churches, and 40 cemeteries were destroyed.



The occupation has seized control over **77%** of the Strip's land.



261 shelter centers were targeted.



The agricultural sector lost \$2.2 billion USD following the destruction of 92% of farmland.

General Humanitarian Data (3)



Two million civilians have been forcibly displaced.



Over 4,700 amputations have been recorded among the wounded.



Over 2 million people have contracted infectious diseases due to displacement, including 71,000 cases of hepatitis.



288,000 families are now homeless.



The Israeli occupation has arrested 6,633 civilians from Gaza, including:

362 medical staff

48 journalists

26 civil defense personnel



Key Humanitarian Updates This Week



WHO Warns of Alarming Malnutrition in Gaza

The World Health Organization has warned that malnutrition is taking a dangerous turn in the Gaza Strip amid a sharp rise in deaths in July, as Israel continues to use hunger as a weapon against civilians.

- The UN agency noted that “most malnutrition-related deaths in Gaza occurred before reaching hospitals or shortly after, with victims showing signs of severe wasting.”
- It highlighted that “1 in every 5 children under five years old in Gaza City is suffering from acute malnutrition.”
- “The current crisis in Gaza is severely affecting pregnant and breastfeeding women, with recent data showing that more than 40% suffer from acute malnutrition. The situation is particularly critical in the central area.”



People Trapped in Ever-Shrinking Spaces

Around 88% of the Gaza Strip is now designated as part of the Israeli military zone, under evacuation orders, or areas where such orders overlap, as of July 23.

- According to the United Nations, at least 1.9 million people—about 90% of Gaza's population—have been displaced during the war. Many have been displaced repeatedly, some 10 times or more.
- The latest report from the Site Management Working Group on population movements indicates that 762,593 people have been displaced since the collapse of the ceasefire on March 18, 2025.



Health Response Severely Undermined

Gaza's health response continues to face critical operational challenges, including severe damage to health facilities, restrictions on safe movement, and limited entry of medical supplies and fuel.

- UNRWA has not been permitted to bring in any humanitarian aid—including medicines and medical supplies—for 4.5 months (since March 2, 2025).
- At least 189 UNRWA facilities—more than half of all UNRWA facilities in Gaza—are located in areas under Israeli military control, under evacuation orders, or where these orders overlap.

Key Risks Threatening the Sector

Displaced Residents in Gaza City Face Disease Outbreaks Amid Extreme Deprivation



Displaced people in Gaza City are grappling with disease outbreaks spreading through their makeshift camps due to piled-up waste and Israel's starvation policy, which has forced them to scavenge for scraps of food to survive and feed their children.

UNRWA Medical Services Severely Undermined by Resource Shortages

- More than half (57%) of essential medical supplies have already been depleted, and nearly one-fifth (18%) are expected to run out in less than two months.
- Affected supplies include medications for non-communicable diseases, antibiotics and antiparasitics, dermatological and ophthalmic treatments, painkillers and anti-inflammatory drugs, gastrointestinal and respiratory medications, as well as family planning supplies.



Gaza Students Deprived of Exams for the Second Consecutive Year

- Over 16,000 students have been killed.
- More than 750 teachers have died as a result of the ongoing war.
- More than 650,000 students have been denied access to education.

Healthcare Sector

- 1 Fuel for hospitals
- 2 Medicines and medical supplies
- 3 Field hospitals
- 4 Supplies for safe childbirth in hospitals
- 5 Postpartum kits



Shelter Sector

- 1 Mattresses and blankets
- 2 Tents for IDPs
- 3 Cash intervention



Relief Sector

- 1 Food parcels, fresh bread and canned foods
- 2 Drinking water
- 3 Cooking gas
- 4 Clothing
- 5 Fuel for municipalities to operate water pumping stations
- 6 Cash intervention (Gaza and West Bank)
